#### **Executive Committee Meeting – December 14, 2021**

Tomorrow, December 14th, the TACC Executive Committee will be meeting for the last time this year at the PYCO Industries facility in Lubbock. The agenda for the meeting includes discussing the Council's preliminary audit results conducted by D. Williams and Company on November 11-12 and a review of TACC office operations.



#### Farm Store Summit - January 13-14, 2022

For the past two years, TACC has taken the opportunity to host a meeting focused solely on the farm store side of the co-op operation—specifically, how to return profitability to these centers. This year's speakers will share, from their own unique vantage points, how vision, focus & strategy are integral to the future success of cooperative businesses. A new addition this year will be a vendor showcase highlighting companies, across the state, that TACC member co-ops use in their businesses.



# Cooperative Board Chairmen's Conference – January 19-21, 2022

For the first time ever, this meeting joins both the Ruidoso, NM conference and the Corpus Christi School ---- into one statewide board chair effort. The goal is to provide co-op board presidents with nuggets of information to better "manage" the remaining director team and tools to become a better "partner" with the general manager.



#### Texas Academy in Cooperative Excellence - January 28-30, 2022

In cooperation with the five regional cotton cooperatives, Capital Farm Credit, & the Roy B. Davis Chair, TACC is once again offering an exciting program to connect the dots with the newer generation of farm families & co-op leaders by introducing them to alternative business structures, with a special emphasis on the co-op business model. With several heavy hitters from the co-op industry on the meeting agenda, this program is sure to deliver!



#### **Director Development Program - February 15, 2022**

This is a long-held conference for co-op directors to get their annual dose of board training --- new challenges, latest legal cases, recently-surfaced co-op tax issues, and new methods for guiding & governing cooperatives. Given the exceptional participation last year, TACC will also be offering an abbreviated virtual program on February 17 via Zoom.

# **HIGHLIGHTING TACC'S PROOF OF RESTORATION**

(Like many businesses and trade associations, TACC also had to maneuver through the minefields since March 2020 as a once in a lifetime pandemic impacted the 87 – year old organization and its membership. With regards to handling business, everything was on the table and every day was a mystery. With the guidance of a very understanding and patient board and executive committee, the organization reached some new achievements...)

- With regards to the 2021 State Legislative Session, TACC served the 65 member ag commodity lobby group --- The Texas Agriculture Council --- in numerous roles: as immediate past chair, treasurer, and coordinator of the organization's website.
- A South Texas Cooperative Leadership Conference returned in Corpus Christi after a one year absence.
- TACC has visited numerous universities, having a College of Agriculture, over the last 13 years to help
  recruit for its Summer Co-op Internship Program. In 2021, the Council added a new college --- Texas A&M
  Kingsville. Several quality candidates were interviewed & one was selected to intern at United Ag in El
  Campo.
- Monitored & was active in the 2021 State Legislative Session, where over 7,400 bills were filed and TACC primarily tracked about 45 that had a special interest to cooperatives.
- Launched the focus for the new year to be: "Co-ops: Local Choices, Local Decisions, Local Rewards".
- Developed "Legislative Readiness Papers," whereby each TACC PAC member co-op were prepared
  papers containing contact information on their respective county, state and federal leaders as well as
  pertinent regulatory state agency contacts impacting their organization.
- Made the decision to pilot combining the Ruidoso, NM Co-op Board Chairmen's Conference held in July
  with the similar South Texas Conference usually held in November and move it to a central location
  (Fredericksburg) and at a time conducive to both groups (January 19 21, 2022).
- Continually tracked state regulatory actions occurring during and after the 2021 State Legislative Session so as to monitor how passed legislation is being proposed to be implemented and carried out.
- Continued a multitude of forums to communicate with the membership via daily Facebook postings, launching a new LinkedIn page, production of email newsletters, development of infographics, information blitzes, & the hosting of 8 – 10 educational meetings for a variety of audiences.
- Joined with other agricultural groups to host a salute to law enforcement luncheon at the State Capitol in May 2021.
- Continued to serve on the State Board of the Certified Crop Advisers --- a role that began with its inception in 1993 --- and serve as chairman of its credentials committee.
- Coordinated with the D. Williams and Company CPA firm in Lubbock to produce another every five year "Co-op General Manager Compensation Study".
- Continued job posting services to help cooperatives in labor recruitment.
- Attended about 25 fundraisers in an effort to support appropriate candidates in political races via TACC – PAC.
- Assisted in the development of a first ever "State FFA Ag Advocacy" Conference, where 36 ag teachers and 114 FFA members came to the State Capitol for two days. It was so successful that the next one is planned for February 2022 and they are expecting between 350 – 400 attendees. Does agriculture have a bright future?
- Did considerable research to launch a new program for co-op leadership in January 2022, whereby more
  accurate, measured and calculated hiring and management decisions can be made; thus greater efficiency
  in handling management decisions.



# AFTER ONE YEAR PANDEMIC ABSENCE, SOUTH TEXAS CO-OPS RECONVENE IN CORPUS

The TACC South Texas Cooperative Leadership Conference was held in Corpus Christi on November 3 – 4 at the Omni Hotel, after a year absence, attracting nearly 80 co-op personnel & directors. The kick-off speaker, **Bruce Atherly**, flew in from Istanbul, Turkey. He is CEO of the export promotion arm of the National Cotton Council, but once held roles with major consumer product companies. In addition, noted ag meteorologist **Brian Bledsoe** of Colorado Springs, CO., stole the show with his weather predictions for the next 12 months. In addition, **Gary McLaren** led his traditional legal charge with eye-popping cases occurring in co-op country. **Dr. Jennifer Wells**, with Truterra (*the carbon marketplace arm of Land O'Lakes*) gave an insightful look at where farmers fit in with regards to sustainability, and noted co-op CPA **Greg Taylor** of Lubbock, gave his take on the new tax language being offered by the Biden Administration.

One of the more interesting segments at the meeting occurred when regional cotton co-op executives **Robert Swize** of Gulf Compress, **Cris Gwinn** of Plains Cotton Cooperative Association, and **Jim Massey** of Valley Co-op Oil Mill took the stage to project what it would take for co-ops to remain relevant in South Texas over the next ten years. The landscape is rapidly is changing! Co-op creative leaders **April Graves** of United Ag Co-op in El Campo and **Tony Morton** of PYCO Industries in Lubbock took an unusual look at explaining financial statements by reporting on two new ventures that have occurred at their co-ops in recent time.

The conference kicked-off with its traditional Shrimp Boil, cooked by Smith Gin Co-op General Manager **Tyler Cross** and Valley Co-op Oil Mill Sales Manager **Aaron Peña**. In two years, the conference will relocate to San Antonio to bring variety. One other unusual twist to the meeting were the door prizes. Although it is tradition to award about \$1,400 in door prizes of throughout the day in denominations of \$50 to \$100, this time only five or six door prizes were given, but the total remained about the same. The biggest and the concluding door prize, donated by **Jimmy Roppolo** at United Ag Co-op in El Campo, went to **Kreece Wiginton**, who works at Woodsboro Farmers Co-op (*grain & farm supply*) in Woodsboro, Texas. It was a pistol valued at over \$600.

#### TACC DIRECTOR APPOINTED TO STATE AGENCY BOARD

The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) is one of the largest regulatory agencies in the state overseeing numerous functions that impact citizens. A few years ago, state lawmakers moved all fuel sales and such regulation from the Texas Department of Agriculture to the TDLR. Due to this action, the seven – member commissioner team created the TDLR Motor Fuel Metering and Quality Advisory Board to oversee the transfer and operation of this fuel function.

The newest appointee to the state regulatory agency advisory board is TACC Legislative Committee Chair and General Manager of Producers Co-op Elevator in Floydada, Texas, **Seth Stephens**, effective December 7, 2021. The commission, chaired by **Rick Figueroa** of Brenham, made the appointment of Stephens. A native of Weatherford, Stephens started at the Floydada co-op in 2012 as an intern out of Texas A&M University and in 2014 was named General Manager/CEO. He is also the former Floyd County Republican Party Chair. State Senators **Charles Perry** of Lubbock and **Drew Springer** of Muenster were instrumental in his appointment, which will last until February 2023.

#### **DEVELOPING A CULTURE OF CONSTANT EDUCATION**

A new online training course has hit the market, produced by Texas A&M AgriLife & Roy. B Davis Chair, **Dr. John Park**, with collaboration from TACC CEO, **Tommy Engelke**. The first video is active, and can be accessed online at AgriLife Learn. In this first session, co-op employees, managers, and directors will be introduced to the need for constant education in a cooperatively-owned business and understand what this looks like for different levels of governance. This course is priced at \$25, and can be completed at the individual's own pace. This is an exciting opportunity for TACC to further its education directive and we highly encourage you to tap in, understand the need and benefits of constant education, and develop this culture in your own cooperatives!
