Stout Program Driving Expected **Big** Crowd to Ruidoso Co-op School

If plans continue as is, nearly 200 people are expected to invade the Inn of the Mountain Gods Resort (*575-464-7777*) in Ruidoso, NM for TACCs annual Cooperative Managers' Conference on July 11 – 13, 2018. Some 13 high-powered speakers will dominate the program with a focus on attacking labor shortage issues in agribusinesses. In addition, an individual that works at the regional sugarcane co-op in the Rio Grande Valley and serves as their safety and compliance officer, will discuss OSHA inspections and how to deal with them. He also trains OSHA safety inspectors.

Other features will be the topic of dealing with a variety of personality types and will be handled by a nationally - recognized leader on the subject. The point – person from Washington D. C. behind all the controversy over the new IRS tax law on Section 199 / 199A will also be with us. One of the "sleeper" topics that will likely blow people away will be on how to begin planning a long – term effort for eventual retirement, what questions to ask if you are about to retire, and how to / how not to file for social security. There are big differences!

"What's surprising to me about this conference", says TACCs **Tommy Engelke**, "is how this conference has grown in recent years even though agribusinesses continue to merge --- go figure!"

He'll explain!

Program runs from 10:15 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. and will include House Ag Committee Chairman Tracy King of Uvalde and topics on animal welfare demonstrations, feral hog control, pesticide use, gun safety, a game warden, and a discussion on proper use of eminent domain.
