COUNCIL SELECTS 2020 SUMMER CO-OP INTERNS

Ten years ago, the TACC Board of Directors issued a declaration that our industry needs to do its part to attract top talent and thus the summer co-op internship was borne. Since that time, an ingredient was added --- to build greater relations with university personnel and better expose them to the co-op business model.

After visiting multiple classes at five universities in the Fall and Spring, followed by countless webinar – type interviews, four students were selected for the 2020 summer. They are:

• Emma Ferguson – a junior ag economics student at West Texas A&M University from Gruver, will be placed at Hereford Grain Corporation under the direction of CEO <u>Dennis</u> <u>Artho</u>. She graduates in May 2022, was an intern at Texhoma Wheat Growers in 2019, has the American FFA degree & was on the state winning FFA Senior Chapter Conducting Team.

• Kristina McGowen – will graduate in August 2020 from Tarleton State University with a degree in ag business management. She calls home Brownwood and was an intern for a farm credit co-op in 2019 --- Lone Star Ag Credit. In the interviewing process, Kristina decided to forego the internship portion and was hired full-time by <u>Cris Gwinn</u> at Plains Cotton Cooperative Association in Corpus Christi.

• Nicole Laskowski – is a 4.0 ag business major at Texas A&M University that will graduate in May 2021. She grew up on a farm just south of Stockdale, worked for the San Antonio Express – News & will now work under <u>James Deatherage</u>, CEO of Producers Cooperative Association in Bryan.

The Council was the third, out of 65 ag commodity groups in Texas, to begin an **email** newsletter and that was in 2004. Then, on December 1, 2016 launched what was to be one of the first ag groups in Texas to host **Facebook** posts. It has been doing so DAILY since that time. With the coronavirus pandemic, TACC shifted its focus once again when it hosted its first – ever Joint Cooperative Meeting by **webinar** on May 5, 2020 (*in the absence of having to cancel its planned in - person meeting at The Woodlands Resort near Houston in mid-March*).

TACC has also added another new technology feature --- LinkedIn. This format will be used primarily in distributing papers and educational lessons of short duration for people to access at their pleasure.

The top four Facebook posts by TACC in the last few weeks were:

April 28 – this post was received by well over 600 people explaining that ag represents less than 10% of all greenhouse gas emissions in the U.S. & this number is continuing to decline.

May 8 – this post had nearly 600 reaches and talked about what some co-ops are doing for kids with show animals in light of many county fair cancellations. Amazing responses!

April 29 – this received nearly 300 responses and dealt with **Jimmy Roppolo** at the El Campo co-op hosting a drive – in movie at his cotton gin yard one night where nearly 500 people attended.

May 5 – this captured a host of viewers too regarding the joint effort of CoBank's CEO and Land O'Lakes CEO to join with Microsoft CEO to jointly sign a letter sent to all 50 Governors expressing the need for rural broadband services.
