# TACC Adds New Jechnology Wrinkle: On Demand Training

As the workforce changes, so does the approach to keeping them "trained". Over the years, TACC has attempted to adjust with the times by having conferences, then specialized notebooks, next targeted conferences, followed by tweaks in presentation styles, and the latest being one – on – one outreach meetings with co-op boards of directors; along with co-op attorney **Gary McLaren**.

TACC debuted September 1, "on demand training", whereby co-ops can pay the Council a fee of \$375 and have access to more than 400 training videos anytime of the day, any day of the week. The videos are executive level in their approach and cover such topics as time management, overcoming the challenges at being a new director, board effectiveness, being a first - time manager of people, people skills, and many more.



TACCs **Tommy Engelke** says of the program, "This is a real break – through for us and a tremendous opportunity for all levels of people in the co-op to stay current on their responsibilities, however the real long - term benefit will be when we can develop our own in-house training programs targeting specialized topics that only pertain to a co-op!"

# TACCs Joint Cooperative Meeting *Keynote* Line-up Doesn't <u>MISS</u> a <u>BEAT</u>!

TACC has finalized the headline speakers for the Joint Cooperative meeting to be held March 10-12, 2019 at the Horseshoe Bay Resort, Horseshoe, Texas --- Michael Graczyk and Michael Benfante!



For 34 years, Michael Graczyk has made a living watching people die. He is a veteran Associated Press journalist assigned to witness his first execution in March of 1984. He estimates that he has witnessed over 400 executions — which means he's seen more of these ceremonies than anyone else in the country. Graczyk will join us to share his fascinating story and the impacts and conclusions he witnessed.

Michael Benfante became a national hero for his actions on 9/11, when he and a co-worker carried a disabled woman in a wheelchair down sixty-eight flights of stairs and out of the World Trade Center North Tower to safety, just minutes before the tower imploded. He is the recipient of a host of honors and international recognition, and has testified at a US Senatorial special hearing about his 9/11 experience. Benfante is a 1987 Brown University graduate. He currently lives with his wife and son in Bloomfield, New Jersey and recently appeared on a two-hour TV documentary.



As was reported earlier, these two speakers will be joined by television celebrity **Anita Renfro**, who will address the Spouses Program on Monday.
